<u>Item 3. Gaston College Textile Technology Center and Fiber Innovation Center Overview</u>

The Centralina Economic Development District (CEDD) supported Gaston College in securing an EDA Grant under the Assistance to Coal Communities initiative. This grant awarded \$1.1 million to Gaston College to purchase advanced manufacturing equipment to support existing textile and apparel firms, strengthen the talent pipeline, and promote entrepreneurial opportunities at the Fiber Innovation Center.

Jasmine Wade-Cox, Executive Director of the Textile Technology Center, provided a comprehensive overview of the center's activities and training programs. These include four key product development areas and three specialized testing laboratories. Gaston College offers three textile education pathways for students and customized training programs

tailored for incumbent workers, ensuring a well-prepared and skilled workforce for the textile industry.

The Fiber Innovation Center will serve as a hub for advancing fiber technology, driving innovation, and supporting the development of high-performance, sustainable materials for a wide range of applications.

Item 4. Tour of Harney Hall and the new Fiber Innovation Center

Board members participated in a walking tour of the facilities, gaining firsthand insight into the intricate process of converting fibers into yarn and then into fabric. They learned about the diverse applications of these fabrics, including clothing, upholstery, fire protection, household items, and industrial products.

<u>Item 5. Working Lunch - Regional Workforce Development Discussion</u>

Board members engaged with Ms. Cox-Wade, asking insightful questions about various aspects of the Textile Technology Center's operations. They inquired about current enrollment numbers, the extent and nature of partner collaborations, and the specific employers that utilize the facility's resources and training programs. This interactive session provided a deeper understanding of the center's impact and the strategic partnerships that contribute to its success.

2024 CEDS Annual Update

In its second year of implementation, the Centralina Economic Development District (EDD) continues to make significant strides in advancing the goals of the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), guided by the overarching vision of **Prosperity of All**. This vision focuses on creating a globally connected, inclusive, and prosperous future for the Greater Charlotte region by fostering collaboration among businesses, stakeholders and individuals.

In 2024, progress has been made on 44 out of 58 CEDS action items, with marked improvements in Urgent, Critical and Moderate priority areas. The region has also seen advancements in digital inclusion, workforce development and transportation infrastructure which contribute to continued economic growth and resilience.

2024 Highlights and Accomplishments

Goal 1: Expand Economic Opportunity

The Centralina Workforce Development Board collaborated on numerous statewide initiatives, including the NC Business Service Summit and several in-person and virtual hiring events.

Recognizing childcare as a critical and trending topic, the Centralina EDD team, with support from the Southeast Crescent Regional Commission (SCRC) funds, facilitated an interactive discussion with economic developers, childcare providers, and local government officials to develop actionable solutions and share best practices. We amplified the childcare message by presenting to North Carolina Community College leadership at their annual conference and hosting a webinar that brought together industry leaders, economic developers, and workforce partners to share the latest updates and initiatives.

Goal 2: Build Community Supportive Infrastructure

Centralina continues to advance Connect Beyond, expanding the LYNX Silver Line and securing funding for passenger rail corridor projects. The region received grants to improve roads safety and develop Resilience Improvement Plans, ensuring the continued safety and connectivity of the region's transportation network.

A Regional Digital Inclusion Framework was developed to address the digital divide, providing strategic solutions for increasing access to broadband and digital literacy across the nine-county region.


Goal 3 Strengthening Regional Resilience and Global Competitiveness

Centralina has partnered with UNC Charlotte and the Charlotte Regional Business Alliance on the Carolinas Innovation Center for Optics and Metrology (CICOM) Tech Hub Strategy Development Grant. This collaboration has made progress in highlighting challenges and opportunities to formulate a workforce approach that will prepare workers for jobs in optics and metrology. Other key activities in the CICOM project included launching a workforce survey, conducting focus group meetings and presenting information at the Consortium Summit meeting on October 2, 2024.

The Centralina Regional Resilience Collaborative (RRC) identified critical gaps in regional recovery planning, and this prompted the development of Anson County's Pre-Disaster Recovery Plan. This achievement marks the completion of the RRC and Anson County's plan, enhancing the region's preparedness and resilience. Furthermore, Centralina strengthened regional capacity for economic recovery by administering the NCARCOG FEMA Public Assistance Financial Administration Training program, providing essential guidance for financial management in post-disaster recovery.

Progress on CEDS Action Items

In 2024, there was substantial progress in the advancement of CEDS action items, particularly in *critical* and *urgent* categories. The number of advancing items increased significantly across the board.



This progress reflects the strong and growing momentum in implementing the CEDS action plan, with fewer items remaining in the early or uninitiated phases. In this second year of execution, the pace of activities continues to accelerate, demonstrating Centralina's commitment to advancing regional goals.

Implementation Activities are categorized by priority: **U** for Urgent, **C** for Critical, and **M** for Moderate. Notably, two Urgent action items have not been started due to funding challenges.

- Centralina EDD team hosted a forum to discuss the Role of Childcare in the NC Economy. There were 26 attendees from local government and economic development partners. C Goal 1 – 3.1
- Centralina Workforce Development is participating in a Childcare working group as part of the Good Jobs Great Cities grant received by City of Monroe.

- Rowan County Manufacturers Network collaborated with local manufacturers, Centralina and Commute with Enterprise program to explore solutions for workforce mobility to employment centers. U Goal 2 – 1.1
- CONNECT Beyond is forming a task force of stakeholders to examine connected and autonomous vehicles and their technology. **C Goal 2 1.3**
- Centralina Planning hosted a Joint Roundtable Meeting between the Gaston-Cleveland-Lincoln MPO and the Charlotte Regional TPO. There were 80 attendees from across the region. **C Goal 2 2.1**
- Centralina formed the Integrated Mobility Center (IMC) to provide technical assistance and coordination for transportation planning. The IMC also facilitated a regional discussion on future passenger rail corridors, fostering collaboration among transportation organizations. **U Goal 2 1.2**
- In partnership with CRTPO, Centralina launched an initiative to provide a training and develop a playbook to help communities implement tailored mobility-supportive development strategies. **U Goal 2 1.2**
- The Centralina team collaborated with Charlotte Area Transit System (CATS), City of Belmont, and Gaston County to finalize funding to complete 15% of the design for the LYNX Silver Line extension from I-485 west of CLT Airport to Belmont. U Goal 2 – 1.2
- Centralina collaborated with NCDOT Rail to secure funding for Service Development Plans for multiple passenger rail corridors in the Centralina region. U Goal 2 – 1.2
- Centralina Area Agency on Aging surveyed adults 60+ in the Charlotte region on ridesharing barriers and provides a Transportation Guide to help older adults and caregivers access reliable mobility options. **C Goal 2 1.3**
- Centralina supported CRTPO in securing a \$5 million RAISE grant to fund safety audits in underserved and transportation-disadvantaged communities across Iredell, Mecklenburg, and western Union counties, boosting regional road safety. U Goal 2 – 2.2
- Centralina is collaborating with CRTPO and Gaston-Cleveland-Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization to seek federal project funding to develop Resilience Improvement Plans. U Goal 2 – 2.2
- Centralina received a Regional Infrastructure Accelerator grant from the US DOT for CONNECT Beyond implementation, including building an Integrated

- Mobility Center and building out project service lines for finance innovation, pipeline project facilitation and transit-orientated development. **U Goal 2 3.2**
- The Centralina Regional Resilience Collaborative (RRC) identified gaps in recovery plans, leading to the development of Anson County's Pre-Disaster Recovery Plan, which was officially adopted in May after eight planning meetings. M Goal 2 – 3.3
- In February Centralina hosted two FEMA Regional Disaster Recovery Financial Administration trainings supported by NCAROG to help municipalities improve pre-disaster resiliency, mitigation and post-disaster recovery efforts to assist local governments in managing funding assistance. **M Goal 2 3.3**
- In April, the EPA approved the PCAP (Pollution Control Action Plan), marking a significant milestone in advancing regional environmental efforts. M Goal 2

- Continuing to focus on expanding mobility options through the Connect Beyond Regional Mobility Plan, with special emphasis on Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) and sustainable transit solutions.
- Proceeding with full implementation of the Digital Inclusion Plan across the Centralina region, ensuring all residents have access to broadband and digital literacy resources.
- Continue to build on the success of recent environmental grants by developing further strategies for climate resilience and expanding infrastructure projects that align with the region's sustainability goals.
- Seek additional resources to continue the Centralina Regional resilience Collaborative and the update the Regional Resilience Equity and GIS mapping tool data tool data layers and user interface.
- Continue to advance efforts to collaborate with consortium members in pursuing the CICOM Tech Hub Strategy Development Grant.
- Collaborate with workforce and economic development teams to deliver timely, relevant topics that address talent solutions and business needs.



CEDS ACTION ITEMS DASHBOARD



The CEDD dashboard chart (October 2023 and October 2024) shows progress in implementing the CEDS action items, highlighting shifts in the number of *Advancing, Initiated*, and *Not Started* tasks across three priority categories: *Urgent, Critical* and *Moderate*.

The data reveals significant progress in the implementation of CEDS action items, especially in the Advancing phase. The number of advancing items increased across all categories, rising from 2 to 6 in the Moderate category, from 2 to 14 in the Critical category (a 7-fold increase), and from 17 to 23 in the Urgent category. This reflects an overall substantial improvement in the advancement of tasks.

In summary, the October 2024 data demonstrates strong progress, with many tasks advancing, fewer items in the initiated or not started phases, and increased momentum in executing the CEDS action plan.

Highlights & Accomplishments April - October 2024

Regional Engagement

- The Centralina Workforce Development Board team took part in a statewide Business Service Summit to design and develop a framework for delivering business services. Goal 1 – 2.1
- NCWorks Career Center-Cabarrus used a person-centered approach to support TTEC, a local employer, in filling 200 remote positions (\$16-\$23/hour) by organizing virtual hiring events with partners throughout the region, resulting in 86+ participants and multiple full-time hires. Goal 1 – 2.1
- NCWorks Career Centers, local Economic Development Organizations and their partners in Anson, Cabarrus, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Rowan, Stanly, and Union counties each hosted spring career fairs that atrracted high attendance among graduating seniors and jobseeker. Goal 1 – 2.2
- Lincoln Economic Development Association received the 2024 Excellence in Economic Development Bronze Award from IEDC with its *Early Success* and *Future Promise* of the MyFutureNC initiative in Lincoln County.

- The CEDD team collaborated with partners from Mecklenburg County, the City of Charlotte, and Leading on Opportunity in a committee focused on exploring childcare solutions for local government. Goal 1 – 3.1
- CEDD delivered a presentation to NC Community College leadership at their Annual Conference on the role of community colleges as catalysts for childcare solutions and economic growth. **Goal 1 3.3**
- The CLT Alliance Foundation, through its initiatives, RISE (Regional Innovation & Support for Entrepreneurs) Scale Up CLT and African American Leadership Academy of Charlotte is strengthening the entrepreneurial ecosystem by mapping resources to improve outreach, connectivity, and diversity among entrepreneurs across the region.

- The Centralina Workforce Development team actively participates in the Charlotte Regional Collaborative for Global Workforce, a quarterly meeting of Community College presidents in the region, to discuss strategies and initiatives for enhancing workforce development and global competitiveness. Goal 1 – 5.1
- Centralina's Executive Committee adopted the regional Transportation Demand Management (TDM) plan, which will move into program implementation. A CRTPO grant will fund a pilot project for TDM in Iredell, Mecklenburg, and Union counties is underway, with site selection by yearend. Goal 2 – 1.1

- Centralina formed the Integrated Mobility Center (IMC) to provide technical assistance and coordination for transportation planning. The IMC also facilitated a regional discussion on future passenger rail corridors, fostering collaboration among transportation organizations. Goal 2 – 1.2
- In partnership with CRTPO, Centralina launched an initiative to provide training and develop a playbook to help communities implement tailored mobility-supportive development strategies. Goal 2 – 1.2
- The Centralina team collaborated with Charlotte Area Transit System (CATS), City of Belmont, and Gaston County to finalize funding to complete 15% of the design for the LYNX Silver Line extension from I-485 west of CLT Airport to Belmont. Goal 2 – 1.2
- Centralina collaborated with NCDOT Rail to secure funding for Service Development Plans for multiple passenger rail corridors in the Centralina region. Goal 2 – 1.2
- Centralina Area Agency on Aging surveyed adults 60+ in the Charlotte region on ridesharing barriers and provides a Transportation Guide to help older adults and caregivers access reliable mobility options. Goal 2 – 1.3
- Centralina supported CRTPO in securing a \$5 million RAISE grant to fund safety audits in underserved and transportation-disadvantaged communities across Iredell, Mecklenburg, and western Union counties, boosting regional road safety. Goal 2 – 2.2
- Centralina is collaborating with CRTPO and Gaston-Cleveland-Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization to seek federal project funding to develop Resilience Improvement Plans. Goal 2 – 2.2

- The Town of Matthews and CED completed a sidewalk extension near the downtown district, enhancing pedestrian safety and promoting mobilityfriendly spaces. Goal 2 – 4.4
- The 2024 update of the Prosperity Profiles was released, featuring a comprehensive overview report on regional economic trends and growth opportunities. Goal 2 4.4

- Centralina developed the Regional Digital Inclusion Framework to help counties close the digital divide, offering an analysis of the current state of digital inclusion, county-specific data, and tailored strategies to achieve digital inclusion goals across the nine-county region. Centralina EDD Board members will receive an update on the progress of the Carolinas Innovation Center for Optics and Metrology (CICOM) and engage in a discussion that further supports CICOM's efforts to position the Charlotte region as a national hub for optics and metrology.
